L: Linger *adjective*

To Linger verb (intransitive)

1. to remain or stay on in a place longer than is usual or expected, as if from reluctance to leave it.
2. Also, linger on. to remain alive; continue or persist, although tending to cease or disappear: hope lingers.
3. to dwell in contemplation, thought, or enjoyment.
4. to be tardy in action; delay; dawdle.
5. to walk slowly; to saunter along. – verb (transitive)
6. to drag out or protract.
